This course will provide introductory training to Illinois law enforcement agencies regarding the transition to National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) and Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program guidelines. It will provide an excellent overview of the NIBRS reporting elements with an emphasis in what is NIBRS, offense categories, and data elements required for each category.

- Group A – Crimes Against Persons
- Group A – Crimes Against Property
- Group A – Crimes Against Society
- Group B Crimes
- Data Elements

This training is ideal for command staff and records personnel responsible for accurate and timely report submission of UCR. As the FBI MANDATES the transition to NIBRS, it is essential to have personnel from your agency attend to prepare for the future reporting of NIBRS here in Illinois.

If your agency does not submit compliant data, you may not be eligible for certain federal grants. Additionally, other grant opportunities in Illinois could be affected. Do not jeopardize your agency's ability to secure grant funding due to non-compliance in crime reporting!
